What to do when things slow down in winter?

The second business is HomeSafe Environmental Testing. We do testing

I was on Dragon's Den years ago with my product - the Magnatec 60 EMF Sensor - a consumer product for testing 60 Hz EMF. I intend to re-launch it in the next 6 months.
